Can you give our readers a couple of bullet points about you personally?

You had an extended career with the Navy.

What other activities have you done with Eastern Star?

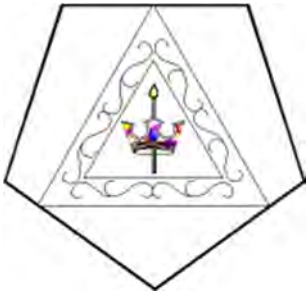
