Our hearts are heavy as we mourn the passing of Helen J. Westmoreland, Past Most Worthy Grand Matron of General Grand Chapter and Past Grand Matron of Florida on August 13, 2022.

Sister Helen was born on April 3, 1936 in Munson, Florida to the late Mr. and Mrs. Dan Gordon. After graduating from Red Level High School in 1953, she met Victor Sloan Westmoreland of Charlotte, North Carolina, on a blind date. They married on October 15, 1954 in a small ceremony. Helen committed the next 50 years of her life to him.

Helen began her career as a telephone operator on Eglin AFB. Five years later, Vic was stationed in Bovingdon, England; where she joined him on their first great adventure together. She loved every minute of living overseas. They returned to Florida in 1962 and purchased their home in Valparaiso, where they lovingly raised their daughter, Karen, who was born in 1964, and became the apple of Helen's eye. Helen continued her civil service work and was promoted to Eglin's Communications Squadron. She finished her career working as a comptroller for the Eglin Finance Office. She took great pride in her work and was highly awarded for her many accomplishments as a civil servant. Having a humble upbringing in rural Alabama as the oldest of seven siblings, she was certainly not a stranger to hard work, honesty, and perseverance; these traits were further honed during her thirty-five year civil service career and later as a member of the Daughters of the Nile, the Order of the Amaranth, American Business Women's Association, Beta Sigma Phi sorority, but most prominently as a General Grand Chapter Officer in the Order of the Eastern Star.

Sister Helen was initiated into Niceville Chapter No. 254, Order of the Eastern Star, on February 16, 1968. She served as Grand Marshal for the Grand Chapter of Florida in the Atkins/Massam Grand Family in 1981-1982. In 1993, she was elected as Associate Grand Conductress, going on to serve as Worthy Grand Matron of the Grand Chapter of Florida in 1996-1997 with Brother Robert D. Fiedler by her side as the Worthy Grand Patron. Their Session was named "Precious Memories" Session. With the support of Florida, she was elected at the 2000 Triennial of General Grand Chapter held in November to the position of Right Worthy Grand Trustee. Sister Helen became known as Florida's Hummingbird. She had many years of traveling as she advanced through the line until in 2015 when she was elected and installed as Most Worthy Grand Matron of the General Grand Chapter with Brother Robert C. Penoyer as her Most Worthy Grand Patron. During these 3 years, Sister Helen supported a myriad of organizations with regenerative medicine and first responders being particularly near and dear to her heart. She never let an opportunity pass to tell people about the organization which meant so much to her. Orlando was the place to be seen in 2018, as hummingbirds and supporters flocked for the Forty-Ninth General Grand Chapter Triennial Assembly, "Precious Memories on the Wings of Love".

Sister Helen is preceded in death by her husband, Victor Westmoreland. She is survived by her daughter Karen Madruga, grandchildren, Jaime Toploff, spouse Josh and Austin Madruga, spouse Abbye, great-grandchildren, James, Benjamin and Peter Topliff, sisters, Faye Dean and Peggy Peabody, brothers-in-law Robert Westmoreland, James Westmoreland and Don Kearns. Visitation was held at McLaughlin Twin Cities Funeral Home in Niceville, Florida on August 19, 2022. Funeral Services were held at Crosspoint Church of Niceville, Florida on August 20, 2022 followed with a reception.

Sympathy is extended to her family, the members of Niceville Chapter No. 254, the Sisters and Brothers of this Grand Jurisdiction, the Westmoreland/Fiedler Grand Family and the Sisters and Brothers of the General Grand Chapter that she loved so dearly.

In tribute to her memory, let this Memorial be read in each Subordinate Chapter at the first stated meeting after its receipt and the Altar be draped for thirty days or two stated meetings.

We were greeted by Josh Newby, President/CEO of the Council and Emily Echevarria, Marketing Communications Director. Josh provided us with a lot of information about what the Council does and whom they help.

Council on Aging of West Florida is a local, independent 501 (c)(3) not-for-profit organization that has served seniors and their families since 1972. Council on Aging of West Florida helps seniors in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties live healthy, safe, and independent lives in their own familiar surroundings by providing community-based, in-home programs and services such as Meals on Wheels and

Alzheimer's respite care, which is provided by our Adult Day Care Center. Other programs and services include case management,



the Foster Grandparent and Senior Companion Programs, caregiver support and training, and the operation of numerous senior dining sites throughout Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties. They currently help about 20,000 people and have approximately 1,000 volunteers.

Worthy Grand Matron Presents \$10,000 Check to First Baptist Church in Apopka to Feed the Hungry

November 2022

On Friday, November 18, members of the Wise-Kranz Grand Family, and other members of the Grand Chapter of Florida met in Apopka at the First Baptist Church. We were there to present a check for their Monday Night ministry program, "A Message of Hope" where they feed and clothe the homeless.

We were greeted by Pastor David Schorejs, who has been with the church for eight years. He knew taking care of his local community was a priority and wanted to use his spiritual gift of encouragement to help those around him. The church is in downtown Apopka, and the surrounding neighborhood was home to a large population of homeless and destitute people.

Each Monday evening, the church hosts a dinner, where the homeless can come get a warm meal and other needs. They offer each person or family a "blessing bag" which contains snacks and personal necessity items. They then go into the Fellowship Hall, where they are seated and served water, tea or coffee. A warm meal is enjoyed, followed by the evening message. In addition to the meal, the people can also take a shower, get a haircut, and put in a request for clothing items from the church closet which has a good selection of clothing in many sizes. The number one requested need now is blankets as we head into the winter season.

Pastor David told us that they see anywhere from 45 to 60 people each Monday. While some have become familiar faces over the past six years, they have had some success stories. The ministry's goal is to show the people that they deserve a new chance at life. They have helped some reconcile with their families and have been able to help them get home to a family member that is willing to help them.

The room contains a multitude of wigs in different shades and styles, and they have some prosthetics and bras available for breast cancer patients. We were told that they have had people come all the way from Jacksonville for assistance.

Sister Michelle "Mickey" Wise, Worthy Grand Matron and Brother Bill Kranz, Worthy Grand Patron presented the donation from the Grand Chapter of Florida for \$10,000 to go towards their feeding the hungry program. They were so very grateful and sent messages of appreciation to the Order. Each dinner costs the ministry around \$500, so we will help cover about 20 meals!

This organization continues to amaze and inspire me with its generosity. It was such a privilege to go and see where our help is needed and appreciated.




This is our third year participating in this worthwhile project and our members enjoy sharing with the less fortunate children in the area.

In Their Own Words

Corey Young



I grew up with my Sunday school teachers and my parents telling me that I was going to be a pastor in the future. I even taught a few lessons in my Sunday school classes when I was younger. I never put too much stock into being a pastor or working in ministry because I wanted to play professional baseball. But as I grew up and reached high school, I knew that the whole baseball thing was not going to work out. I never thought twice about being a pastor and immediately switched to

becoming a Criminal Psychologist. All throughout high school and into my first two years of college this is exactly what I strived to do. I majored in criminal justice in college and was on track to becoming a Criminal Psychologist.

During the summer of my sophomore year of college, I went on this retreat with the BCM (Baptist Collegiate Ministry) club at my university and was challenged by the speaker that weekend to take some time and get alone with God and search my heart for what God may be speaking to me. So, I went out on the beach at night and spent some time in prayer and the Lord kept bringing up those old conversations with my parents/teachers about me being a pastor. It was undeniable that the Lord was speaking to me, but I continued to make excuses.

I had already started my degree process for criminal justice and was scared to death to work in ministry. I continued to fight it for a whole year until the next summer when one of the student pastors at my church asked me to speak to the students one night in the fall. I hesitantly said yes, but again was scared to death. That same summer I went on a mission trip to Israel and visited a lot of biblical sites while I was there. One of these sites was the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed for God's will to be done in His life and not His own will be done.

When searching my heart for something to pray at this significant location, I just kept thinking about God's calling on my life and how I had been wrestling with it. So, at that moment, in that location, I prayed for God's will to be done in my life and not my own. I surrendered my life to ministry and have never looked back. God's faithfulness has been put on display time and time again throughout this process. One way that God has provided for my family and me is through the ESTARL organization. When it came time for me to start my Seminary journey, I was very worried about how we were going to pay for it. We have a baby on the way and do not make a lot of money.

We stepped out in faith and that is when I learned about the ESTARL scholarship. This organization has been so gracious to my family and will always be a part of my pastoral journey.

I was born and raised in a Christian home. My earliest memories were of going to church with my parents and grandparents. I loved those days, and even then, had a strong desire to know more about Jesus, the Bible, and the church. My parents decided to send me to a private Christian school when I was

four. Once I started kindergarten, I specifically remember Christian Education class. It was then that I decided I wanted to be a priest in our church one day.

In college, I had a different plan and pursued a Bachelor of Science degree at the University of South Florida with the hopes of attending dental school. However, while at USF, I joined The Navigators. My time with them was one of the best experiences of my life. Through the Navigators, God was preparing me for a life of ministry within the church, as had been my desire as a small child. I had no idea what I would do after graduating from college, but I trusted God and struggled not to try to take control and go my own way.

As it turned out, God did have a plan and brought me home to Christ the King Anglican Church as the Youth Minister. I felt so unequipped, which I have found has been a good thing, because it has made me learn to fully rely on Christ. I have grown in many ways during the 12+ years God has had me work with our students.

In the spring of 2020, God called me to begin seminary. After many meetings and prayers, I began my seminary experience in the fall of 2020 at Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky. It has been a blessing to attend ATS as they have hybrid campuses in Orlando and Tampa. So, while much of my work has been completed online, I have also had the opportunity to have much class time in person at the local hybrid campuses. Meeting fellow seminary students has been one of the highlights of the past few years.

During this time in seminary, God has deepened my call for parish ministry. I was ordained a deacon in September 2022 and will be ordained a priest in 2023. This last year of seminary has really equipped me for God's call, and that call has become clearer over the past few months. While going through the ordination process with the bishop, it became clear to both of us that after ordination as a priest, I will remain on staff as the assistant priest at Christ the King Anglican Church in Ocala.

It has been amazing to see God at work throughout this seminary experience. I am also even more amazed and blessed that my dream as a four-year-old, of serving as a priest at my childhood church, is becoming a reality. God has blessed my life greatly, and I am so blessed to have the support of so many people. God is good!

I realized my need for Christ at a young age. I was five years old when the Holy Spirit first convicted me of sin and drew me to a relationship with Jesus Christ. I began to seek God with all my heart. I also began to seek freedom from my addictions. God delivered me in a miraculous fashion. He began to communicate with me in dreams and through other people.

After receiving some much-needed discipleship, I started to serve Jesus with all my heart. A few years later, I met my wife. We have been married for four years now. She is the perfect example of a Proverbs 31 wife, and is exactly the woman I prayed about for many years. She loves God more than she loves me, she is pretty and smart, and she was successful before we met. She is the most supportive and loving person I know.

Once I submitted to His lordship, God allowed me to be a children's minister, and then a youth pastor. I have also been blessed to serve with multiple youth ministries along the way, including my current church home where I preach regularly on Wednesday nights. Just recently, I was asked to return to Pruitt Health to continue as their chaplain after a two-year hiatus due to covid restrictions. I believe this journey has just begun and I cannot wait to see what God does next.

I began my academic journey with the intention of becoming a youth pastor. However, through God's direction and provision, I realize that youth ministry is not His purpose for me; but rather, a life spent serving families through hospital chaplaincy.

I now have a very concentrated direction that will help shape me as a Christian and establish a foundation for effective ministry using the gifts and talents given to me by God. After completing my BA in Ministry at BCF, I will attend Liberty University where I will pursue my M.Div. in General Chaplaincy. Following that, I will work toward becoming a board-certified chaplain in order to work in hospital chaplaincy. In addition to the aforementioned goals, I will also seek to earn a D.Min. in Biblical Studies. The D.Min. will open additional doors in ministry, and a potential career in higher education.






